

Surgery: Definition?




 n. the branch of medicine concerned with the treatment of bodily injuries or disorders by incision or manipulation.


Proposed dictionary definition

TABLE 1. Criteria for Promotion in Global Surgery		
Criteria Similar to Usual Promotion Criteria		
	Education	Training students, residents, or other trainees from the HIC institution on site in LMIC partner institution.
	Research publications	Publications in global surgery would be equally valued as other publications.
	Administration	Administering/directing the HIC institution's side of formal exchange programs or other global surgery activities (eg, global surgery track in a residency).
Criteria undervalued in current promotion criteria		• /
•	Clinical care	Clinical care at LMIC partner institution should be considered; if it is part of partnerships upon which other global surgery activities (eg, training of HIC country trainees, or research) depend.
	Education	Training of LMIC trainees, if it contributes to partnerships.
	Research-funding	Given currently minimal funding and given how effective even small amounts can be in low-resource settings, small grants are more likely to advance the field and hence should be more highly valued.
	Administration	If part of building partnerships.
Criteria that should not be considered		
	Clinical care	Mission trips or other clinical work that are not otherwise linked to funding, training, research, or building partnerships.



Measuring Impact

Funding is an indication

- Traditionally hard to find but expanding
 - (MEPI/Fogarty Center/NCI/intramural/Gates Foundation?)
- Intramural Sources count-especially early on
- Secure funding for trainees
- Society Grants

Make it locally relevant-parallel projects

- Education of foreign/domestic trainees
- Quality Assurance in resource-poor settings


